From September we have 2 Nursery places available for 15 hours basic but this could increase if eligible for the new 30 hours scheme.

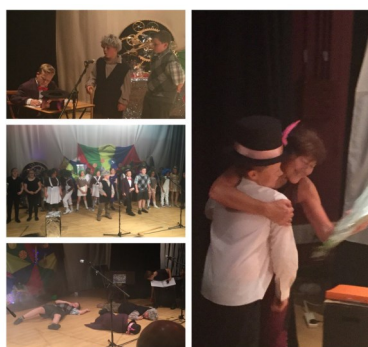
There is also one place in year 6 available from September. Please contact the office for details.

Since April, Ryden has won the U9 Yorkshire Cyclocross, Yorkshire and National

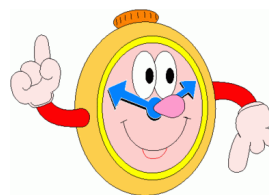
